Initial planning to help you follow through:

PLAN: Decide and commit to what time each day you will pray.

PREPARE: Ask God to give you an openness to receiving divine appointments and opportunities to share.

PLACE: As you pray, make a mental map of the places you will visit throughout the day. Ask God to help you be sensitive to your surroundings.

PEOPLE: Think of the needs of those you are praying for, and ask God to help you be a blessing to them. Try writing their names down as you pray to help you stay focused, and jot down any prompts you might receive from God.
